The Broadcast Pioneers of Philadelphia proudly announces a generous gift by Broadcast Pioneers Life Member Jerry Klein and public relations firm Anne Klein & Associates. It's web server space for our domain name (BroadcastPioneers.com) and our entire website.

What does this contribution mean to you? Well, for starters, NO ADS (unless we want them there!). Until now, our website rests on many different servers and companies. These firms place advertising throughout our pages in return for the free space. We had no control over these advertisements. They pop-up whenever the servers decide. With our new space, there will be no advertisements unless we want them there.

Secondly, the free servers limit bandwidth usage and monitor it on an hourly basis. If we used too much, they would suspend those pages for an hour. While this never affected more than 3% of the site at any time, it still was bothersome.

In weeks and months ahead, you will notice BroadcastPioneers.com becoming more user friendly. This is because all the audio, video and photos will rest on one server. We will no longer need confusing cross-referencing links between companies.

Another advantage to our new system is that files will no longer be limited in size. This means that we will not have to break longer audio or video presentations into pieces. They can be one continuous package. Another perk is that we will no longer have to "dummy down" the quality of our audio in order to meet the bandwidth standards of the free webspace companies. We will now be able to present clearer and cleaner presentations.

It will take months to transfer all the old files from the free, advertising driven servers to our new setup. When we do move material, you may notice the new version having clearer, cleaner sound. That's because we have saved some of the audio files that were not used because of the free webspace companies' limitations. If we have a better sounding version in our file, we will use it. If we don't, we will move the old file to the new server.

When can you start to notice the difference? Well, you're seeing the beginning stages right now. This page no longer has a pop-up ad at the top right of the page. When we start placing audio and video of our "Careers in Broadcasting" night and our 37th annual PERSON OF THE YEAR/HALL OF FAME banquet, these will rest on the brand new setup. These files will be clearer than before.

Another perk with the new system is that our e-mail address is now pioneers@broadcastpioneers.com! While our old e-mail address will function for quite some time, kindly use the new address which is now permanent.

Anne Klein & Associates is owned by <u>Anne & Jerry Klein</u>. Jerry is a life member of our organization. He worked at several radio stations in our market, starting at Temple University's WRTI-FM where he was the last student station manager before it went all-jazz with a paid staff in 1969. He was also a reporter, anchor and morning drivetime editor at KYW Newsradio before becoming a lawyer. Later, he switched to public relations as executive vice-president of Anne Klein & Associates.
